This new report looks at *Accelerated Math*, a software tool that allows instructors to customize assignments and monitor the progress of math students in grades 1-12. The studies in this WWC review looked at middle school students in grades 6-8.

The *Accelerated Math* software can be used in conjunction with an existing math curriculum to add practice components and potentially aid teachers in differentiating instruction through the program's progress-monitoring data.
